# **Guest Speaker**

Dr. Catherine Roach, Professor, New College
Recipient of the 2022 Faculty Innovation and Leadership Award



**Dr. Catherine M. Roach** has 25 years of grant-funded research experience on gender, sexuality, and American popular culture. A two-time Fulbright awardee with a PhD from Harvard and publications in both fiction and nonfiction, she's been an invited visiting professor in Canada, Australia, and Europe. She is Professor of New College, an innovative liberal arts program at the University of Alabama, where she's won the school's top research and teaching awards and where she offers a popular cross-university course titled "Sexuality & Society." Originally from Ottawa, Canada, she is based in Tuscaloosa, Alabama.

Every year the Levitetz Leadership Program awards one New College faculty/team a \$5,000 grant in recognition of their innovation, leadership and creativity in teaching, research, or service. Past recipients include Dr. Barbara Brickman, Dr. Amanda Epsy-Brown, Dr. Scott Jones and Professor Leah Connell, and Dr. Margaret Purcell.
